Joint Fundraising Notice and Contribution Guidelines

The Inhofe Victory Committee 2014 is a joint fundraising committee formed to benefit Friends of Jim Inhofe and the Fund For A Conservative Future.

Contributors to the Inhofe Victory Committee 2014 will be allocated as follows:

- For contributions from an individual or non-qualified PAC, the first \$5,000 received will be allocated to Friends of Jim Inhofe, with \$2,000 applied to the Primary 2014 election and \$3,000 applied to the General 2014 election. After June 24, 2014, Friends of Jim Inhofe will only be eligible to receive the first \$2,000 from an individual or non-qualified PAC applied to the General 2014.
- For contributions from an individual or non-qualified PAC, the next \$5,000 received will then be allocated to the Fund For A Conservative Future.
- For contributions from a multi-member PAC, the first \$10,000 received will be allocated to Friends of Jim Inhofe, with \$5,000 applied to the Primary 2014 election and \$5,000 applied to the General 2014 election. After June 24, 2014, Friends of Jim Inhofe will only be eligible to receive the first \$5,000 from a multi-member PAC.
- For contributions from a multi-member PAC, the next \$5,000 received will then be allocated to the Fund For A Conservative Future.
- Any contribution to Inhofe Victory Committee 2014 by any donor which upon allocation is determined to exceed the contribution limit of that donor to one of the Participants shall be reallocated to the other Participant to the maximum contribution limit allowable from the donor to the Participants.
- Any contributor or portion thereof to Inhofe Victory Committee 2014 which is determined to exceed the contributor limit of that donor to such Participant, as prescribed by 2 U.S.C. § 441a, shall be returned to the donor.

Notwithstanding the allocation formula described above, contributors may be designated by the contributor for a specific Participant as specified below.

Exhibit B

Pigeons have existed in North America since the 1600's, 300 years before Oklahoma became a state. That means they were native to Oklahoma at the time of its creation in 1907. Pigeons do not fall under the state Game Code nor are they excluded from the anti-cruelty statutes. That means they are a protected species.

Oklahoma State Anti-Cruelty Statutes.

§ 1685. Cruelty to animals

Any person who shall willfully or maliciously torture, destroy or kill, or cruelly beat or injure, maim or mutilate any animal in subjugation or captivity, whether wild or tame, and whether belonging to the person or to another, or deprive any such animal of necessary food, drink, shelter, or veterinary care to prevent suffering; or who shall cause, procure or permit any such animal to be so tortured, destroyed or killed, or cruelly beaten or injured, maimed or mutilated, or deprived of necessary food, drink, shelter, or veterinary care to prevent suffering; or who shall willfully set on foot, instigate, engage in, or in any way further any act of cruelty to any animal, or any act tending to produce such cruelty, shall be guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment in the State Penitentiary not exceeding five (5) years, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). Any animal so maltreated or abused shall be considered an abused or neglected animal.

- SHARK's evidence shows that pigeons were willfully kicked, mutilated, shot, wounded, destroyed and tortured.

§ 1686. Abandoned animals--Destroyed how

D. For the purpose of the provisions of this section and Section 1691 of this title, the term "abandon" means the voluntary relinquishment of an animal and shall include but shall not be limited to vacating a premises and leaving the animal in or at the premises, or failing to feed the animal or allowing it to stray or wander onto private or public property with the intention of surrendering ownership or custody over the animal.

- Numerous pigeons were abandoned at the shoot. Some birds were wounded, yet could fly away, while those who were not wounded dispersed to other areas outside the shooting field. As many of these birds appeared tame, they would most likely not have had any ability to survive on their own.

§ 1691. Abandoning of domestic animals along streets or highways or in any public place prohibited

Any person who deposits any live dog, cat, or other domestic animal along any private or public roadway, or in any other private or public place with the intention of abandoning the domestic animal upon conviction, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

- SHARK's documentation shows that some of the pigeons had bands on their legs, meaning they were owned and domesticated. Whether wild or domesticated, the abandonment of these birds is illegal under the law.

Exhibit C

Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation Employees and the Inhofe Political Fundraiser

Employees of the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation (ODWC) attended and worked at a political fundraiser held for Oklahoma Senator James Inhofe, on September 5, 2014. The most important fact to understand is that this was an electioneering event. Every aspect of the day - from being at the Quartz Mountain Lodge, including the outside amphitheater where Senator Inhofe gave a speech - to the trap shooting and, of course, the live pigeon shoot itself were all parts of the fundraiser. The fact that state employees were working at the event means that public tax dollars were used for an electioneering event that supported a specific candidate for office.

In the *Daily Oklahoman* (<http://newsok.com/inhofe-fundraiser-event-causes-flap/article/5344952/?page=2>) it stated the following:

Micah Holmes, information supervisor for the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation, said his agency puts on shotgun training sessions using clay pigeons for church and scouting groups and many other organizations.

This was not a church, boy scout or non-profit event, neither was it a public event that anyone could attend. This was a political fundraiser. The only people allowed to attend, and who the ODWC wardens would have been "training," had to donate money (minimum \$250) to the "Inhofe Victory Committee 2014," which was a joint fundraiser benefiting Senator Inhofe's personal campaign account as well as his Leadership PAC, the "Fund for a Conservative Future."

In an article posted on Guns.com (<http://www.guns.com/2014/09/24/activist-group-releases-undercover-video-of-senators-pigeon-shoot-video/>) it stated the following:

Department of Wildlife Lt. Jeff Headrick was at the fundraiser for an unknown amount of time, but he said he wasn't there in an official capacity and happened to be on the grounds at the same time as the event.

"We weren't there for the pigeon shoot," Headrick told Guns.com. "Our department does some PR stuff ... and we were there with a step trailer, so we do different things for different organizations all the time."

Lt. Headrick would like us to believe that the wardens just "happened" to be on the grounds as if they stumbled upon the fundraiser by accident. That is false.

Statement from the investigator who attended the fundraiser:

When I arrived at the Quartz Mountain Lodge, where attendees of the fundraiser for Senator Inhofe signed in and socialized, I saw a warden with the ODWC. He was wearing his uniform and was not in civilian clothes. I was not sure why a state employee would be at a fundraiser for a candidate for federal office, so I approached and asked him if he was there for the shoot. He told me he was.

An hour or more later, and before the pigeon shoot began, the attendees of the fundraiser gathered at the lodge's outdoor amphitheater where Senator Inhofe made a speech and Congressman Markwayne Mullin was introduced. After reviewing

photographs taken of that gathering, which were posted online by the "Southwest Oklahoma Republican Women," I noted two individuals who appeared to be wearing the ODWC warden uniform.

What this shows is that the wardens did not just "happen" to be at the pigeon shoot location (which was a few miles from the lodge), but were present at the lodge itself and at a number of aspects of the fundraiser, including the political speech given by Senator Inhofe at the lodge's amphitheater.

There were at least two different ODWC trucks onsite at the pigeon shoot. The logo on the ODWC Chevrolet Silverado had "I&E" added to the logo, which stands for Information and Education: <http://www.wildlifedepartment.com/education/contactus.htm>. Part of what I&E does is the "STEP" program. This is actually mentioned by Lt. Headrick in his quote to Guns.com "...we were there with a step trailer."

Here is the ODWC page for the Shotgun Training and Education Program (STEP) <http://www.wildlifedepartment.com/education/step.htm>.

According to their own rules, it states the following:

1. Hunter recruitment and public shooting opportunities – The recruitment of new hunters is accomplished by presenting programs and providing wing-shooting opportunities to various groups that traditionally have little or no exposure to these activities. Such groups include women's organizations, youth groups and school groups as well as other events where the general public is in attendance. These open public events provide wing-shooting exposure to many newcomers who have never tried shotgun shooting.

The I&E program specifically states it is for "open public events" and "other events where the general public is in attendance." The Inhofe fundraiser was a private event. In fact, there were armed sheriff deputies guarding the entrance with the explicit mission to make sure that the public could not even get near the event.

It is critical to understand that the trap shoot was not some separate event, but an absolute part of the fundraiser. No one could even access the property where the pigeon and trapshooting events occurred unless you were part of the fundraiser. That means that not only did the ODWC violate their own publicly stated rules for the I&E program, but by working at the trapshooting event means they were there to specifically promote and facilitate an integral aspect of the Inhofe fundraiser.

The ODWC has been compromised; there is no question that their presence and support on September 5 means that state employees, and therefore public tax dollars, were used on behalf of Senator Inhofe and his re-election campaign.
